


NATIVE UNIVERSE: Voices of Indian America/ Gerald McMaster & Clifford E. Trafzer, editors

This volume celebrates the Native peoples of North, Central, and South America: their beliefs and ceremonies, their history, and the lives that they live today.









SOCIAL SOFTWARE IN LIBRARIES: building collaboration, communication and community online/ Meredith G. Farkas






